

**PHYSICAL SERVICES
COMMITTEE MEETING
January 7, 2019**

Chairman Hill called the meeting to order at 6:47 p.m. in the 2nd floor Common Council Chambers of City Hall.

MEMBERS PRESENT: Councilor Hill, Councilor Wilmott, Councilor DeMassi, and Councilor Gosek.

OTHERS PRESENT: Councilor Corradino; Councilor Tesoriero; Councilor McBrearty; Nancy Sterio, Personnel Director; Kevin Caraccioli, City Attorney; Deborah Coad, City Chamberlain; Tom Kells, Commissioner of Public Works; Brian Chetney, Director of the Oswego City/County Youth Bureau; and Mark Tesoriero, City Clerk.

MEDIA PRESENT: Steve Yablonski, Oswego Daily News; Matthew Ritz, Palladium Times.

A motion to approve the minutes of December 3, 2019 was made by Councilor Wilmott and seconded by Councilor Gosek; minutes were approved by a unanimous vote.

I. OLD BUSINESS: There was no old business.

II. NEW BUSINESS:

Authorization:

1. Mayor William J. Barlow, Jr., received a request from Ellen Clark regarding the Hearts on the Bridge Project for the month of February. There are 16 Hearts with LED lighting. Mrs. Clark is requesting the Department of Public Works Traffic Department place the hearts on the Bridge Street Bridge on February 1, 2019 and remove February 28, 2019. Ellen Clark said everything is the same. She said she spoke to Commissioner Kells and they are all set to put the hearts up and take them down. She said the insurance will be handled again.

COMMITTEE DECISION: Councilor Wilmott made a motion to forward a favorable recommendation to the Full Council authorizing the Department of Public Works Traffic Department to place the hearts on the Bridge Street Bridge on February 1, 2019 and remove February 28, 2019. Councilor Gosek seconded the motion, unanimous approval.

THE RESOLUTION THAT WAS PART OF THE MEETING WILL BE FORWARDED TO THE FULL COUNCIL.

2. Kevin C. Caraccioli, City Attorney, recommends a favorable consideration of a request by Congressman John Katko to renew the current District Office Lease by amendment

through the entire 116th Congress. Mr. Caraccioli said the lease expired on January 2, 2019. He said it is virtually the same lease as was previously entered into. He said it is a lease for \$1 and the same space is being provided. Councilor Corradino said the contract states there will be assigned parking for the Congressman and his aides. Mr. Caraccioli said the spots that are now the electric charging stations were designated for Congressman Katko's office representatives. He said he doesn't know how the Mayor traded off those spots for another. He said he will find out that answer.

COMMITTEE DECISION: Councilor Wilmott made a motion to forward a favorable recommendation to the Full Council granting approval to renew the current District Office Lease by amendment through the entire 116th Congress. Councilor DeMassi seconded the motion, unanimous approval.

THE RESOLUTION THAT WAS PART OF THE MEETING WILL BE FORWARDED TO THE FULL COUNCIL.

3. Robert Johnson received a request from R.M. Burritt Motors, Inc. for a landfill permit in order to landfill on property they own at 340 State Route 104. Bob Johnson said Burritt Motors is putting on an addition. He said they have the opportunity to start moving some earth in preparation of the project. He said this would allow them to start the process prior to getting the building permit.

COMMITTEE DECISION: Councilor Wilmott made a motion to forward a favorable recommendation to the Full Council granting approval for a landfill permit. Councilor Gosek seconded the motion, unanimous approval.

THE RESOLUTION THAT WAS PART OF THE MEETING WILL BE FORWARDED TO THE FULL COUNCIL.

A motion to adjourn the meeting was made at 6:57 p.m. by Councilor Wilmott. A second was made by Councilor DeMassi, and was unanimously approved.
